AGENDA SUMMARY

Coyote Hills Ohlone Culture School Program Update

Nancy Krebs, Supervising Naturalist of Coyote Hills will share why the East Bay Express voted Coyote Hills the “Best Place to Learn About the Ohlone Indians” and provide an overview of the menu of opportunities offered. Dr. Bev Ortiz, Naturalist and Cultural Anthropologist will provide a brief overview of Ohlone peoples, the registered archaeological sites found here, and both staff will be available to answer questions.

SPCRR Car Barn Update

Staff at the Park District has been working with representatives from the SPCRR to get Fremont Fire Department approval for the entrance drive improvements to serve the SPCRR car barn. SPCRR recently received approval from Fremont Fire for an engineered, compacted aggregate baserock section (in lieu of asphalt concrete over baserock) that will meet the fire vehicle loading requirements. With this approval in hand, SPCRR plans to begin the installation of utilities by the end of June 2011.

Dumbarton Quarry Update

Representatives from DQA, the City and Park District will discuss the constraints on the creation of the original lake concept, the current status of the site and the schedule for the RFP process.

Patterson House Foundation Project

The City of Fremont will be updating the committee on where we are in the project.

Stanford Staging Area

Staff at the Park District is developing plans for the creation of additional parking at the Stanford Avenue entry to Mission Peak. Due to the popularity of this trail to Mission Peak the demand for parking far exceeds the number of stalls at the existing staging area causing park visitors to park on adjacent neighborhood streets. Two (2) potential sites for additional parking are being studied within the immediate vicinity of the existing Stanford Staging Area. The desire is to create as many off-street parking spaces as possible to relieve the pressure on the Stanford Avenue neighborhood.
